



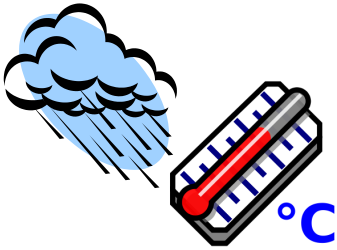
How to Enter Your Data

You will need:

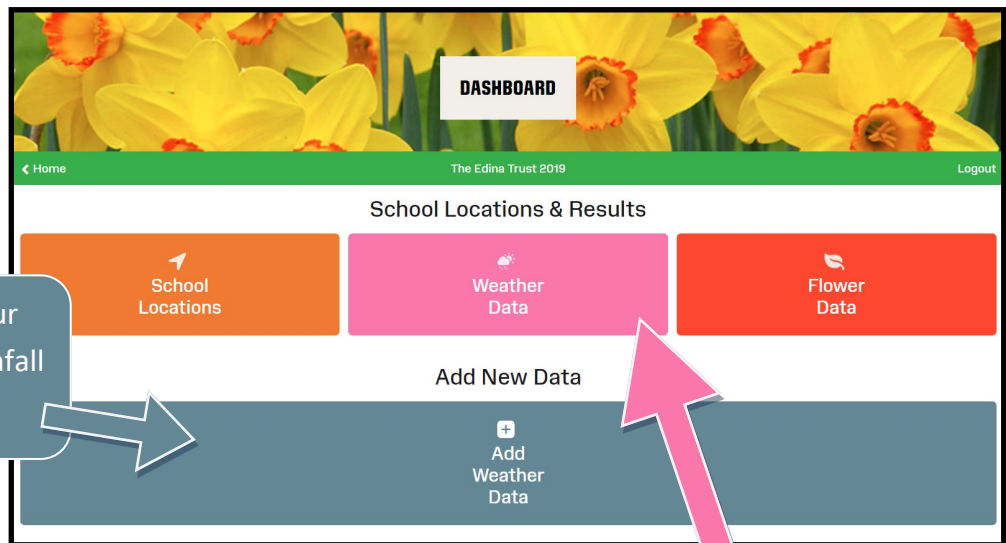
- Your results
- Your login information (write it in the box below)
- A device connected to the internet



1. Go to <https://museum.wales/spring-bulbs/>
2. Click "Schools Login" and enter your school's username and password.
3. You will see a web page that looks like the picture below.
4. Click the button for the data you want to enter.



Click here to enter your weather recordings (rainfall and temperature).



Daffodil and crocus flowering dates and information can be entered from **January** onwards.

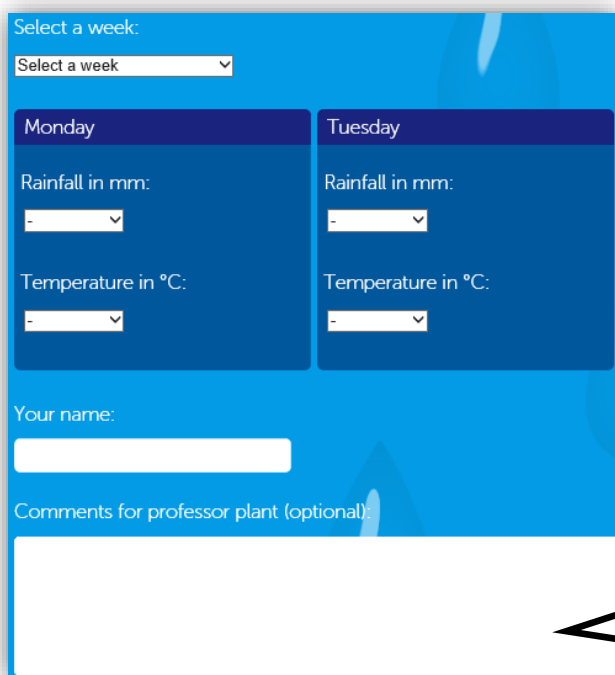
You can take a look at the data sent by other schools and see where they are on the UK map!

You can submit weather data one week at a time. Enter your weather data carefully. Check that your measurements are using the correct units: mm for rainfall, and °C for temperature.

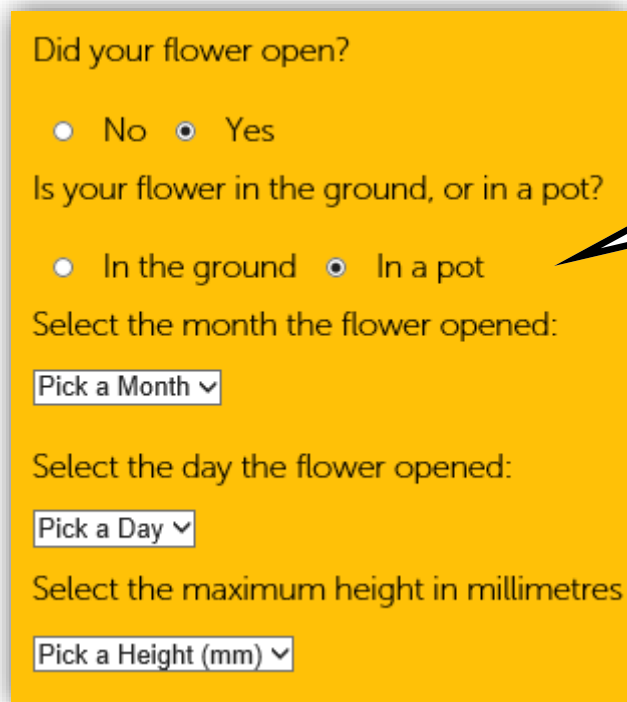

You can only enter flowering data between January and March. If your bulbs haven't flowered by the end of the project, tick 'no' for the first question. This is also important data for us!
